## Road Closure update

From the week commencing 10<sup>th</sup> February, Run For All (RFA) have circulated up to date road closure information to businesses, places of worship, schools and other groups on route via the RFA direct email system. RFA provided the event information and website links for road closure details.

From the end of April, affected residents will receive hand delivered postcards advising them of the event and direct them to RFA website for details. RFA will also distribute specific road closure information for each key area on route to advise of access/egress routes and crossing points. These crossing points are available online using the link below.

Our traffic management company will also install advanced warning signage 2.5 weeks out from the event at key areas around the route to inform road users and residents of the closures.

Road closure information will include an interactive road map, road closure poster, crossing point document, access area arrangements per section of the route and diversion information for Leeds Bradford Airport which can all be viewed on the link below.

## Emergency Care Services

RFA have once again established communications with Jason Lane, the Programme Leader within the Adults and Health Directorate, who is working with RFA to help reduce the impact on Care Homes and Home Care services on event day.

Jason will be communicating with the heads of services for care homes and home care provisions to advise of road closures and has shared key closure information, encouraging the providers to work on their logistics for the day. RFA have offered a managed access service, whereby these provisions can apply for a pass which will detail their requirements for crossing points and specific instructions and timings. This can be applied through the Run For All website.

## Transport Update

Following feedback on the transport services in 2023 and alterations in 2024, RFA have made the decision to repeat those arrangements made in 2024 for 2025.

Please find details below:

- Park & Ride – Elland Road and Stourton with drop off on Beechwood Crescent
- City Centre Shuttle – From O2 Academy with drop off on Beechwood Crescent
- Park & Stride – Cinder Moor

RFA will be working with First Travel Solutions again to provide the transport services for the event. Once again, all transport services are ticketed to allow for close management of capacities. RFA have appointed a professional parking contractor to manage the sites with traffic management installed to provide direction to and from the parking areas.

## Spectator Points

RFA will once again host two spectator points for the 2025 event. Both spectator points will remain the same for 2025 as in 2024. The 1<sup>st</sup> spectator point will be located in Adel on Otley Road with the 2<sup>nd</sup> spectator point located in Otley and Otley Market Square. Spectators will pre-book bus tickets and travel from Queenswood Drive to Otley or Adel. RFA will allocate resources to manage the spectator points and provide community support.

RFA are working with local groups to implement plans and will provide further details in the March update with regards to entertainment, infrastructure and closure times for the spectator points.

## Community Engagement

RFA continue to engage with local community groups to provide entertainment and support for the participants, volunteers and spectators. A number of groups have already signed up which include Garforth Brass Band and Leeds Rock Choir but we always welcome more support.

The event simply could not happen without the wonderful support of our volunteers. With Pudsey Runners, Carr Manor School, Ackworth Road Runners and Bramhope Scout Group being some of those already signed up. We have lots of opportunities for the community to get involved via volunteering.
